

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

REGARDING TRANSFER

between

School of Kinesiology

Capilano University, North Vancouver

and

Department of Kinesiology

College of the Rockies

This memorandum of understanding constitutes an agreement between CapU (CapU) and College of the Rockies (COTR)

Objective of the Agreement:

CapU agrees to facilitate the admission of students from COTR with appropriate prerequisite qualifications into the 3rd year of the CapU Kinesiology. By this agreement, applicants from COTR - Kinesiology who meet the requirements outlined below will be guaranteed admission to CapU with full block transfer, provided all other entrance criteria are met and space remains available.

Terms of Agreement

As a partner to this agreement, COTR agrees

- To provide opportunities for representatives of CapU to visit appropriate forums at COTR to disseminate information about the CapU Kinesiology bachelor's degree organized by the COTR.

As a partner to this agreement, CapU agrees

- To accept students who have completed the Kinesiology credits at COTR (as shown below) with a minimum Cumulative Grade Point Average of 5.0 (CapU 2.5) directly into the 3rd year of the Kinesiology at CapU and to provide provisional acceptance to applicants who apply in Years 1 or 2 of their COTR program.
- Wherever possible, to count any undefined transfer credits towards graduation so that students are able to complete the Kinesiology degree with as close to 120 credits as is possible, given the requirements of the degree.
- To provide COTR with updated information about CapU programs regularly including marketing materials and logos.
- To include COTR as a transfer institution in appropriate CapU communication and marketing material.
- To inform COTR on the number of students accepted and their collective success.

Provisions

To receive a Diploma in Kinesiology from College of the Rockies students must complete the following:

- 30 credits in year 1: 7 required KNES courses, 2 KNES or non-KNES elective, COMC 102, and an English course
- 30 credits in year 2: 8 required KNES courses, 1 KNES elective, 1 non-KNES electives

To complete the first 2 years in the BKINE program in Kinesiology at CapU, students must complete the following:

- 30 credits in year 1: 6 required KIN courses, 2 non-KIN electives, and an English course
- 30 credits in year 2: 6 required KIN courses, 1 KIN elective, 2 non-KIN electives, and a Communication course

If COTR students complete the minimum requirements for the Kinesiology Diploma, they will be missing the following credits, which are included in the BKINE core curriculum:

KINE 125 Introduction to Leadership in Health and Physical Activity

This course focuses on understanding self and personal leadership. It covers a broad range of leadership topics from understanding self and group behaviour, teamwork, organizational design, ethics and change.

KINE 161 Leisure and Sport in Society

This course provides an introductory analysis of political, economic and social issues in leisure and sport. Students will examine present day problems, myths and stereotypes in leisure and sport.

KINE 296 Kinesiology Career Seminar Series

This course provides Kinesiology students the opportunity to hear from, and interact with, current professionals in the performance, health and wellness industry while refining their presentation and public speaking skills. Students will be in contact with people from some of the various career paths they may be interested in pursuing, fostering professional inquiry and opening the door for networking and future course selection.

For COTR Students who have completed the following, credits will be awarded in the corresponding upper level CapU courses.

Exchange of Information

Both parties will provide updates regarding changes to their courses and programs that are anticipated and/or approved.

Both parties agree to make information about this arrangement available to their respective relevant Kinesiology departments and students.


This agreement is implemented through the Registrar’s Office at each institution, in consultation with the appropriate authorities in the respective programs.

Duration and Termination of the Agreement

The agreement shall be in place for a period of five years commencing (April 05, 2022). At the end of this time, the agreement will be subject to review and renewal by Capilano University. If there are impediments to renewal, CapU will notify COTR of the impediments, with the goal of negotiating a new agreement. Final approval of the agreement will remain with (Dean) at Capilano University.

This MOU may be terminated by either party at any time provided that the terminating party gives written notice of its intention at least six months prior to termination. CapU retains the right to limit the number of students admitted under this agreement.


