Adventure Tourism Business Operations Diploma will be awarded to a student who completes ALL ATBO first year core courses, and ALL ATBO second year core courses, and a minimum of 12 credits from the choice of elective credits.

i.e. A student who completes the MAST Certificate and transfers into the ATBO Diploma, will then need to do the following courses to complete the ATBO Diploma:

3. ACCT 263– 2nd year course
4. ATBO 201– 2nd year course
5. ATBO 207– 2nd year course
6. ATBO 208– 2nd year course
7. ATBO 210– 2nd year course
8. ATBO 213– 2nd year course
9. ATBO 221– 2nd year course
10. MKTG 281– 2nd year course
11. Any 3 credit academic elective course
12. A minimum of 6 credits from the choice of elective courses

These courses can be completed in 1 year of studies at the Golden campus, College of the Rockies.
