MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING REGARDING BLOCK TRANSFER



between College of the Rockies Cranbrook, BC



and

Coast Mountain College Terrace, BC

This memorandum of understanding constitutes an agreement between Coast Mountain College and College of the Rockies.

Objective of the Agreement:

College of the Rockies (COTR) agrees to facilitate the block transfer of students from Coast Mountain College (CMTN), Business Administration – Accounting Concentration and General Management Concentration programs, with appropriate prerequisite qualifications into the 120 credit COTR Bachelor of Business Administration in Sustainable Business Practices degree. By this agreement, applicants from CMTN who meet the requirements outlined below will be eligible for admission to COTR with full block transfer, provided all other entrance criteria are met and space remains available in the Bachelor of Business Administration in Sustainable Business Practices degree.

Terms of Agreement

 - o (Appendix B- Business Administration Diploma- General Management)

As a partner to this agreement, CMTN agrees:

- To provide opportunity for representatives of COTR to visit appropriate forums at CMTN to disseminate information about the COTR programs;
- To notify COTR when changes are made to the Business Administration Accounting Concentration and General Management Concentration program curriculum; and
- To provide COTR with updated information annually about the CMTN programs.

As a partner to the agreement, College of the Rockies agrees:

 To provide students holding the Business Administration – Accounting Concentration and General Management Concentration programs from CMTN with academic acceptance into the Bachelor of Business Administration in Sustainable Business Practices degree at COTR;

- Whenever possible, to count any undefined transfer credits towards the Bachelor of Business Administration in Sustainable Business Practices degree requirements to avoid students from having to unnecessarily take additional courses to qualify for graduation; and
- To provide CMTN with updated information about the COTR programs on an annual basis.

Provisions

• This transfer agreement features guaranteed admission into the 3rd year of the Bachelor of Business in Sustainable Business Practices degree for students who have successfully completed all of the courses in the agreement with a CMTN GPA of 2.33 (C+) with a minimum grade of C on transferred courses.

Exchange of Information:

Both parties will update the other with respect to changes in their courses and programs that are anticipated or approved.

Both parties agree to make information about this arrangement available to their respective relevant institutional departments and students.

Implementation of this agreement will be through the Registrar's Office at each institution, in consultation with the appropriate authorities in the respective programs.

Duration and Termination of the Agreement

This agreement shall be in place for three years commencing January 1, 2021. The agreement will then be subject to review and renewal. If there are impediments to renewal, COTR will notify the transfer partner of the impediments, with the goal of negotiating a new agreement. Final approval of the agreement will remain with the President of College of the Rockies.

This MOU may be terminated by either Party at any time provided that the terminating Party gives written notice of its intention at least six months prior to termination.

COTR retains the right to limit the number of students admitted under this agreement.
