4.7 Business Arising and/or New Business

4.7(a) Africa Conference

Ms. Bowron provided information on the upcoming Africa Conference. Stephen Lewis is our Guest Speaker and will be speaking at COTR's Lecture Theatre on Sunday, October 21, 2:30 pm. A portion of the proceeds will go directly to the Stephen Lewis Foundation. The former UN Special Envoy for HIV/AIDS in Africa, Stephen Lewis is co-Director of AIDS-Free World, a new international AIDS advocacy organization. A second speaker has been identified - Mrs. Elaine Mukuru who is the Chair of the Forum for African Women Educationalists (FAWE) in Kenya. One of Mrs. Mukuru's areas of expertise is influencing policy and advocating the importance of access to education for females. This presentation is scheduled for Friday evening, October 19, 2007. 4.10 (a) Chair's Report

4.12 Information and Good of the Institution

4.12 (a) K. Bonell – President, CORFA

Ms. Bonell stated that she was very pleased to hear that faculty is recognized how they came together to cover the schedule for the Economics course and will share that with them. Some of the topics reported by Ms. Bonell included:

- Kevin Higgins (an instructor in the ABE program) sent an email today that he had 19 students stay with the computer course that they offer. 13 of the students returned this year and one of the students is taking a COMP 80 course. He has 27 students registered this year.
- Gretchen Whetham, Kevi Remple, Pauline Bennison and Kathy Bonell traveled to Ecuador in various capacities this summer. Gretchen, Kevi, Pauline and Kathy will be doing a presentation in the Lecture Theatre on September 19 from 4:30 pm to 6:00 pm and everyone is welcome to attend. There is a presentation tonight from 7 pm to 9 pm in the Lecture Theatre regarding biodiversity and conservation.
- Sandi Lavery asked that Kathy mention that the Mount Baker Coaching and the HKIN program development are hosting the first 1-2-3 Fall Classic at the track on October 4th.
- The Computer Repair Centre is in the next week.
- Gina Bennett is gathering information about the possibility of nominating a program at COTR for Excellence in Distance Education award.

4.12 (b) United Nations Declaration

Mr. Sebastian noted that the United Nations is voting on (and may have already ratified) the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous People in spite of opposition by the Federal Government of Canada who has asserted that if this non-binding declaration was to pass, and if they endorsed it - it would be binding, and that the declaration that states specific things, i.e. rights for indigenous people to speak their language, practice their traditional culture, etc. - those things could affect the constitution of this country. Mr. Sebastian thought it was important to bring this issue forward as this is the first time the United Nation has ratified a non-binding agreement that states globally what the rights of indigenous people are, and that our country is one of the few in the world that is actually opposed to having a non-binding agreement to that effect. If the position of the Federal Government is that the right of indigenous people is against the constitution, then we have to wonder what the constitution of our country stands for.

4.12 (c) Thank You

Dr. Rubidge extended sincere thanks to staff in IT, Financial Services, Facilities, etc because they had to work extremely hard over the summer and people had to put up with a

lot of uncertainty because we didn't know when things were going to happen. People have put in huge efforts over the last few weeks.

As well, Dr. Rubidge extended a thank you to Bob Langin for his leadership and support over the past several years and as Board Chair.
